Rocky Mountain House and District Recreation, Parks and Community Services

The Recreation, Parks and Culture Board requires one member from the Town of Rocky Mountain House to provide assistance in developing policies and guidelines and making recommendations to both the Town of Rocky Mountain House and Clearwater County on matters relating to the arena, pool, community centre, athletic fields and playgrounds.

Subdivision Development Appeal Board (SDAB)

The Tourism and Economic Development Board facilitates the promotion and expansion/enhancement of tourism and economic development in the Town of Rocky Mountain House. These positions will be responsible for preparing for the consideration of Council, a Tourism and Economic Development Plan for the Town and facilitate implementation of this plan and provide direction and advice to Town Council on tourism and economic development
