Rezoning

Following a public hearing, Council rezoned a 2.52-acre parcel of land in Old Town to Flexible Residential. This zoning allows for additional permitted and discretionary uses under the Land Use Bylaw and matches existing zoning of adjacent properties.

Town Hall Building Assessment Update

Council reviewed a 2011 evaluation report of the Town Office building that identified several structural and operational deficiencies. While the building is architecturally in relatively good condition, it is non-compliant with building code requirements and is reaching its end-of-life expectancy. Council will consider funding for a town office feasibility study in its 2022 budget.
