Feeding of wildlife within Town limits

Rocky Mountain House Councillors welcomed Fish and Wildlife Office Connor Noyes to discuss <u>wildlife-human interactions and conflicts in Town</u>. While most wildlife interactions can be mitigated through education, Mr. Noyes asked Council to consider a bylaw prohibiting feeding of wildlife as an additional tool to protect both humans and wildlife.

Council will consider a bylaw to this effect at its May 18 meeting.

Clean Energy Improvement Program

Council updated the Clean Energy Improvement Program Bylaw to reflect recent Government of Alberta change to the program administrator. Alberta Municipal Services Corporation has been designated by the Minister responsible for the Clean Energy Improvement Program, to support municipalities in Alberta that finance clean energy improvements. The Town of Rocky Mountain House will be one of the first Alberta municipalities to offer this voluntary program to property owners, anticipated to launch in 2021.
