#### **National Police Federation**

Council welcomed a virtual delegation from the <u>National Police Federation</u>. The NFP is <u>advocating against the establishment of a provincial police force</u> in Alberta. The Town of Rocky Mountain House has already expressed its opposition to a provincial police force in a letter to Minister of Justice Kaycee Madu, and thanked the NFP for its presentation.

### Proclamations

May 24 through 28 is <u>Alberta Rural Health Week</u>, celebrating the contributions of rural health professionals and community volunteers whose abilities and efforts enhance the quality of life in rural Alberta.

June 1, 2021 is <u>Intergenerational Day</u>, celebrating the positive influence of intergenerational relationships and age-friendly communities.

June 7 through 13, 2021, is <u>Seniors' Week</u>, celebrating the past, present and future contributions of seniors in this community and throughout Alberta.

### Feeding of wildlife

Council discussed the merits of a wildlife attractant bylaw versus a wildlife feeding bylaw. In April, Council heard from Fish and Wildlife Officer Conor Noyes about the risks of humanwildlife conflict in Town. Council will consider a bylaw to prohibit the intentional feeding of wildlife at its June 8 meeting.

### **Responsible Pet Ownership Bylaw**

Council discussed the merits of updating the Responsible Pet Ownership Bylaw to eliminate cats as a registered pet in Town. This was considered as a means to reduce the annual expense of controlling feral and at large cats. Council asked administration to consult with the Rocky Organization for Animal Rescue (ROAR) and
